Who is worth more? A father who built a life and a family or the dealer who tears families apart?

We admit a client to intensive care which is our work home. The sounds and beeps as familiar to us as the creaks in our childhood homes.

We are comfortable with our skills and with the combined knowledge of our team. Everyone knows their role without even speaking. Sometimes, we feel like we can handle anything. The general public thinks that we maintain distance from people..... but mostly we bond quickly and empathize with our patients.

In the best of times, a father comes in, trailed by his wife and teenage sons. We ask them to step out and then the work begins. Intravenous lines go in running life saving medications, oxygen goes on making it a little easier to breathe, vital signs are closely monitored. While part of the team continues to work with this devoted father, another part gets pulled away to work with a "frequent flyer". This is someone who comes in and out of the hospital on a regular basis.

In this case, this is a drug dealer who has sampled too much of his product. He was discovered "just in time". He was moments from death but was able to get needed medication, had a tube placed in his throat to breathe and was given intravenous medications to help his body come into balance. His critical moments are over and will recover completely.

Back to our father, his heart is still fragile, excitable and all of a sudden it goes into a deadly rhythm, alarms go off, the team gathers and all the knowledge and skills are for naught. The worst has happened. He is gone.

We fight the part of us that wants to judge the value of one life over the other. Who is worth more? A father who built a life and a family or the dealer who tears families apart?

On any given day a nurse will experience the exhilaration of saving a life and the weight of telling a family their loved one is gone. What we cannot do is judge. It is not easy but it is necessary. Sometimes it means we need to leave one area of nursing and go to another to rest our spirit. The best gift is that we can do that. But that tale is for another day.

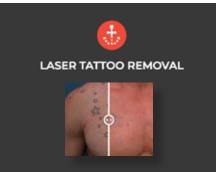

Protecting Yourself Against Shingles



As a pharmacist, I very often interact with patients who are dealing with shingles, also known as herpes zoster, as they come in to pick up prescriptions to treat the virus and its complications. One of the frequent quotes I hear is "I wouldn't wish this on my worst enemy"! The reason is that shingles can be extremely painful and even debilitating. Symptoms often include a rash, pain, and itching that last days to weeks. However, the biggest concerns related to shingles are the long term complications and secondary infections that can develop.

According to the Centers for Disease Control, shingles develops in people who have previously had chickenpox (varicella) and studies have shown that 99.5% of people born in the United States who are over 40 have been infected with the chickenpox virus. Therefore, older Americans are at risk of developing shingles and 1 in 3 adults over the age of 50 will develop shingles in their lifetime. Additionally, the risk of more severe complications also increases with age.

The most common long term complication is Post Herpetic Neuralgia (PHN), or lingering pain in the area where the shingles rash occurred that lasts weeks, months or even years after the rash disappears. Other complications include involvement in the eye which can lead to pain, infection or even vision being affected, a secondary infection related to the skin rash, or rare complications such as pneumonia or encephalitis.

With all of the studies that have been conducted, it is still unclear what causes the dormant chickenpox virus to reactivate as shingles. However, it is clear that people with compromised or suppressed immune systems have an increased risk such as those who have cancer, are on immunosuppressant medications (i.e. steroids or chemotherapy), or have had a bone marrow or solid organ transplant. There are many schools of thought that stress is also a big trigger of a shingles outbreak. Finally, even patients who have experienced shingles previously are not immune to a further outbreak. Although it is not clear why shingles can recur, it can and does and some people experience it 2 or 3 times in their lifetime.

So, with all of this depressing news, how do you protect yourself from shingles? Great question! As of this year there is a new preventative vaccine called Shingrix. This new vaccine contains an adjuvant that boosts the body's immune response to the vaccine. Other differences

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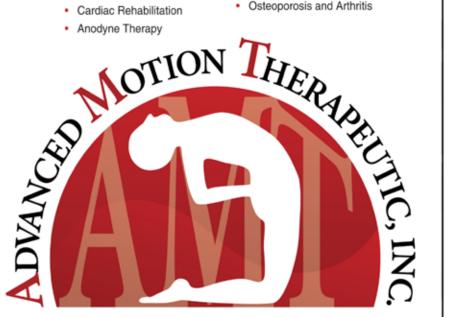
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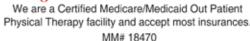

from Zostavax, the prior shingles vaccine, are that Shingrix can be given to patients who are immune compromised, it is indicated for age 50 and up (instead of 60 and up), and the overall effectiveness is much greater. In fact, studies have shown that Shingrix is effective in up to 97% of patients versus 51% for Zostavax.

Shingrix and Zostavax are covered by prescription benefits, not Medicare Part B like many other vaccines such as flu and pneumonia. In Florida, vaccines can be performed by than \$100 per vaccine. Side effects include pain at injection site and some malaise the first day following the vaccine, but seem relatively self-limiting.

Shingles can be very miserable, but it can also be prevented. I encourage you to learn more about options to prevent it. And, if you do ever develop symptoms of shingles such as a rash on one side of the body that is painful, itchy or blistery, see your physician right away. If you start antiviral therapy within 48 hours,



pharmacists under "standing orders" so you will not need a prescription if you go to a pharmacy to receive it. Shingrix is also a 2 dose series, so it is very important that patients receive their initial dose and then a follow up booster between 2 and 6 months later to ensure its effectiveness. Because Shingrix is a 2 dose series, patients will incur 2 copays, however, many of the copays we have seen have been less

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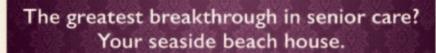

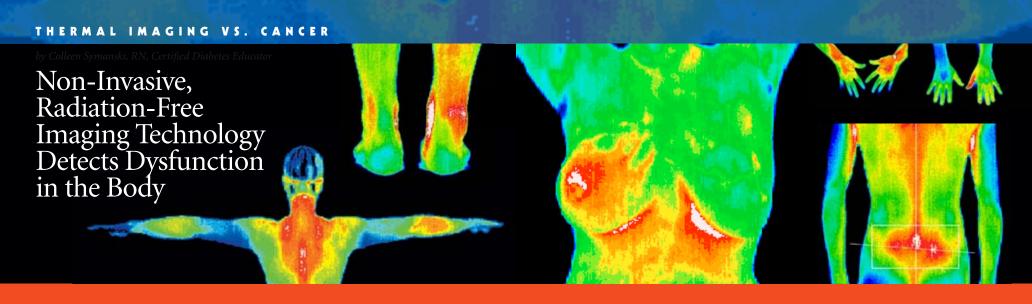

Thermography of Brevard, LLC, is owned by Katie Ainsley and Shelly Gardner. Katie and Shelly are both breast cancer survivors who were diagnosed in their early thirties and neither had a family history of breast cancer. After meeting through a breast cancer support group; Katie and Shelly decided to partner together to bring thermography services to Brevard and Indian River Counties. They are both certified as clinical thermography thermographers (CTT).

Thermography/ thermal imaging, also known as digital infrared thermal imaging (DITI), detects heat patterns on the skin's surface. Digital Infrared Thermal Imaging (DITI), or Thermography, is an FDA approved, non-invasive, radiation-free imaging technology. It measures and maps heat patterns on the skin's surface which are evident through the

sympathetic nervous system. The heat patterns are captured using an ultra-sensitive medical infrared thermal camera. Thermography detects dysfunction in the body by detecting the hyperthermia or hypothermia patterns on the skin's surface and can show increased blood flow and metabolism changes; it can be used as a risk assessment tool to detect and monitor abnormal physiology in the body. Physicians trained in thermography, examine changes in the temperature, patterns and blood vessels, for dysfunction, asymmetric patterns, abnormalities and signs of possible cancer or pre-cancerous cell growth before they might be detected using other diagnostic procedures. Breast thermography is a screening tool used alongside a primary test like a mammography and does not replace a mammogram.

Thermography has been approved by the FDA as an additional diagnostic screening tool for breast cancer and other uses such as: peripheral vascular disease, neuro-musculoskeletal disorders, thyroid gland abnormalities, and various other neoplastic, metabolic and inflammatory conditions. Such as arthritis, back and neck pain.

Thermography of Brevard and now, Indian River Thermography is with the thermology company Meditherm. Meditherm has been in business for over 20 years and has over 40,000 systems in use in the United States, in Europe, Australia, Canada, Central America, South Africa. Meditherm has the only HIPPA compliant data base where the reports are stored for future comparison. The benefit of this is that a patient can have their scan done in Indian River County then move across the country or even out of the country and still have their future thermography scans compared to the first one they had done. There is a high standard of consistency. Patient records are stored in a HIPPA compliant database. Your previous records can be referenced (but not seen) by any thermographer nationally or internationally and connected no matter here you get your scan.

New Vision Eye Center opthamologist, Dr. Robert Reinauer just returned from his second mission trip this year with the Christian Ophthalmic Surgery Expedition Network (ChOSEN).

The surgeons who graciously volunteered their time and skills to this mission traveled to Hospital La Carlota, located in Montemorelos, Mexico. They spent a week completing 408 cataract surgeries and 63 retina surgeries for people who would otherwise go without these sight saving procedures.

The patients were extremely grateful for the service that the group of doctors provided, some having traveled long distances in extreme conditions to get the donated procedures.

Dr. Reinauer's passion for helping people began almost a decade ago. He attended his first mission trip in 2008. He was in medical school at the time, and traveled with the organization Medical Ministry International for an ophthalmology project. This first trip inspired him in two ways. He knew he wanted to make ophthalmology his career, and he knew he wanted to provide better care to the people he was helping.

After completing his degree and retina fellowship he began going on mission trips with the Christian Ophthalmic Surgery Expedition Network. He has since gone on a total of six trips and plans to continue going on two to three missions a year with ChOSEN.

Thanks to surgeons like Dr. Reinauer, ChOSEN was able to provide 1,700 surgeries to people in Mexico this past year. Their goal is to spread the word of God, while providing the same caliber of care that one would receive in a surgery center located in the United States.

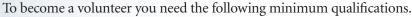
They are looking for volunteers to perform a variety of tasks and assignments. Volunteers are needed in Law Enforcement, Corrections and Support services.

The Volunteers' primary service is to provide residential security checks. This service is for all Sebastian residents and is provided for as little as a few days,









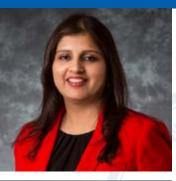


but can extend for up to 6 months or more. The residential security checks are done in a very organized and consistent manner that would not be possible without our dedicated Volunteers.

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VNA's Senior Music Therapist Moreen Burkart Selected Non-Profit Professional Woman of the Year

As a Woman of the Year nominee, Burkart was recognized as a woman who demonstrates high ethical standards personally, is a recognized role model, has a strong sense of community responsibility and is outstanding in her contributions within Indian River County.

As a Woman of the Year winner, Burkart was uplifted for having a positive impact her work has had in our community. Having graduated with a bachelor's

board-certified music therapist. Since the inception of this program, more than 700 hospice patients and families have benefited, and the program has tripled in size, going from just Burkart to three full-time music therapists. She is fulfilling her mission of bringing music therapy to VNA patients as well as the greater community.

VNA's program provides free programming through partner-

ships with organizations like the Scully-Welsh Cancer Center and the Alzheimer and Parkinson Association. Through these collaborations, the VNA's music therapists provide music therapy to individuals battling cancer, both in-patient and at the infusion center, while they are receiving chemo therapy. At the Alzheimer and Parkinson Association, VNA's music therapists provide group music therapy sessions for the Dementiaday program, as well as a weekly neurologic music therapy group, specifically designed for people with

Parkinson's to help improve their gait and balance.

In 2015, the VNA was awarded the prestigious Indian River Impact 100 grant of \$100,000 as of the grant proposal that Burkart co-wrote and presented to the 400 members of Impact 100. She also created VNA's internship program, which is a national roster internship site for music therapy students.

Indian River County Senior Collaborative (IRCSC) is being developed to address the needs of the rapidly growing aging population in Indian River County. Information provided by U.S Census Bureau shows that between April 1, 2010 and July 1, 2016 the population of residents over 65 grew by 4.5% and was estimated at 31.7% of Indian River County's population. There are now over 48,000 residents in this age category. This is greater than Florida's 65 plus population which represents only 19.4% of Floridians. The over 65 population in Indian River County is forecast to continue growing with a projected population of 65,000 in 2030.

The purpose of Indian River County Senior Collaborative (IRCSC) is to improve the quality of life of the aging and also assist their care givers and families in making informed decisions of services available in Indian River County.
