DayAway promotes social inclusion and offers an array of hands-on and technology-driven activities that improve health and cognitive function. Promoting independence, activities include our state-of-the-art Tovertofel "Magic Table," live music, art classes, exercise classes, and more.

Some DayAway participants attend daily while others attend one or two days a week, as their personal situations dictate. All receive proper nutrition, medication administration and increased self-esteem.

EMERGENCY PERSONAL **RESPONSE SYSTEMS**

Personal response services are communication devices for people living at home, who are at risk of becoming incapacitated while alone. The client wears a signalling device, such as bracelet, pendant or separate transmitter. By pushing/activating the button on the device the client calls a Response Center, which sets in motion immediate response to determine need and activate appropriate responders. ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES

For all emergencies or police assistance, dial 911. To report • abuse, neglect, exploitation or self-neglect, call the Florida Abuse Hotline at 1-800-962-2873 (1-800-96-ABUSE) TTY: 1-800-955-8771.

The Adult Protective Services (APS) conducts on-site investigations of reports of alleged abuse, neglect or exploitation involving aged persons (60 and older) and disabled adults (18-59) who are unable to manage their own affairs, protect themselves or carry out daily living activities.

The APS Program is designed to protect aged persons and disabled adults from harm and ensure his/her safety and well-being. Services arranged for may include, but are not limited to: case management, counseling, financial assistance, medical care, legal aid, placement, transportation and protective supervision.

Referrals for protective service come from the protective investigation process after an investigation. The purpose of protective service is to arrange for appropriate care. If the client voluntarily agrees to the proposed care, the process is implemented. If the client does not agree and lacks the capacity to consent, DCF goes to court to obtain court-ordered protective service, in which the Department is given protective custody of the client and is thereby empowered to act in the client's best interest, such as placement in a nursing home or ALF.

Sunshine Daily 211 Telephone Reassurance

Sunshine is a free telephone reassurance program to check on the well-being of seniors, the homebound or disabled. Sunshine service is provided seven days a week between the hours of 7:30am & 5:00pm.

If you are interested in receiving a Sunshine call, just dial 2-1-1 and say that you would like to start receiving Sunshine calls.

211 Hope when you need it most....

As a 501(c)3 non-profit agency, 211 Palm Beach/Treasure Coast is into its fifth decade of providing a team of specially trained staff to assist callers through its 211 HelpLine with crisis intervention, suicide prevention, information, assessment and referral to community services, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Additionally, 211 Palm Beach/Treasure Coast collects and maintains information on community health and human services and makes this information available via its hotlines, helplines, printed directories, and on the web. Services are provided at no cost to anyone regardless of race, age, religion, national origin, sexual orientation, or disability.

• Social Respite:

For caregivers needing a break, we offer free social respite programs in several locations in Indian River County. These popular programs are a much-needed oasis for families who have a loved one with dementia. We are able to give caregivers up to six hours of daily free time while we engage their loved ones in a variety of activities that are uplifting and meaningful, all designed to help improve their quality of life. Currently, social respite programs are located at Indian River Shores Community Center; the Sebastian Yacht Club; Gifford Community Center; and the offices of Alzheimer & Parkinson Association in Vero Beach.

Support Groups:

Support groups are led by trained facilitators and are held on-site and throughout the county for both Alzheimer's and Parkinson's caregivers. The purpose is to provide a network of understanding and friendship that offers practical solutions and informed advice. Many support groups are specifically focused, such as a Parkinson's Caregiver group; a Men's Caregiver group; and a support group for those with a loved one in a facility.

• Community Education & Training:

Regularly scheduled workshops and classes are held to educate caregivers, health care professionals and the general public about memory and movement disorders. As part of its ongoing educational emphasis, the organization offers a "dementia experience" for individuals and businesses to learn how to interact with people with dementia and to become sensitized to the needs of those suffering with memory issues.



• Speaker's Bureau:

Available to local civic groups, schools and businesses. Topics range from "Dementia 101" to "Programs & Services Offered Free of Charge to Families in IRC" as well as other timely subjects related to memory and movement disorders.

Lending Library:

The library has a wide variety of books available for loan, as well as DVD's, brochures and pamphlets for families seeking timely information about caregiving, and Alzheimer's and Parkinson's in general.

• Project Lifesaver:

A program designed to protect, and when necessary, guickly locate individuals with cognitive disorders who are prone to the life threatening behavior of wandering. Those whose dementia puts them at risk for wandering wear a device which transmits a unique tracking signal. When a person wearing this bracelet is reported missing, the Indian River County Sheriff's Office can track and locate them, usually within 30 minutes. The peace of mind that this brings to the caregiver is priceless. The program also serves the needs of parents of children with autism or other related disorders.

• Parkinson's Movement & Exercise Classes:

Several classes are offered throughout the year including Qigong, Chair Yoga, Balance, PD Exercise, Movement at the Museum. Boxing for Parkinson's and Movin & Groovin Music Therapy with the VNA. In addition, we offer a "Land & Sea" program held at The Brennity where "land" exercises in the gym are combined with aquatic exercises in a large indoor heated saltwater therapy pool. In addition, we offer a class called Tremble Clefs which emphasizes voice, diaphragm and facial muscle strengthening for people with Parkinson's and other movement disorders in a rambunctious sing-a-long setting.

• Memory Screening:

Available by appointment for a confidential in-person screening that takes no more than 30 minutes.

HOME HEALTHCARE SERVICES

Home health care providers include state licensed companies and independent health care professionals. Listed below are types of companies licensed by the Florida Agency for Health Care Administration to provide services in the home.

Medicare reimbursed intermittent service companies: These companies are licensed to receive Medicare reimbursement.
 Their services must be ordered by a physician, and you must be home bound to be eligible. The services are intermittent, meaning services are provided for certain times per week for a certain length of time. These Medicare agencies will provide nursing care; physical, speech, occupational respiratory and V therapy; nutritional guidance and medical social services in the patients home or place of residence. When your condition has improved, and you have met your goals, Medicare services are discontinued until you need them and are eligible again.

Hospice Care

Hospice care is designed to provide comfort, palliative care and support to patients and their families when a life-limiting illness no longer responds to cure-oriented care. Hospice care is provided in the patient's home, family member's home, in the nursing facility, ALF (Assisted Living Facility), VNA Hospice House and hospital hospice inpatient beds. VNA Hospice is the only certified hospice program in Indian River County providing these services and care.

Private duty custodial service companies: These services are custodial meaning you can request the service for as many hours and as many days as you need. A doctor's order is not needed. The services are private pay, however, as Medicare will not pay for custodial care. Some long term health care policies and some VA benefits will reimburse these custodial services. These home health companies may provide home health aides and homemaker/companion services in the patient's home or place of residence. There are three types of licenses given for private duty companies. They include agencies, registries and companion services.

Types of private duty companies: As mentioned previously, there are three licenses issued for private duty companies: agencies, registries, and companion companies. The company's license number letters will differentiate the distinction. HHA – agency. NR – registry. HCS – companion.

Agencies - Use their own employees to provide services. These employees are directly supervised by a Registered Nurse, and the employees are covered by worker's compensation and the company's liability policy. Services may include nursing, home health aide, and companion care.

Types of Home Healthcare Services

Social Work

Social workers and case managers are specially trained and knowledgeable about available community resources, social and psychological needs, and family management. Responsibilities include evaluation of home environment and family network, eligibility for federal or state financial support programs, recruitment and coordination of appropriate home care services, psychological counseling, emotional problem solving, overall monitoring of home care plan.

Nursing Care

Services are provided by Registered Nurses (RNs) and Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs). General services include:

General services:

- Observation of patient and evaluation of conditions. Management of care plan.
- Education and training to help patient understand and implement treatment program.
- Supervise LPNs and CNAs (Certified Nursing Assistants).
- Administer specific treatment programs.

Specific skilled nursing home care treatment by RNs:

- Home infusion therapy (intravenous IV therapy), including nutrition, fluid replacement, antibiotic therapy, pain management medication, chemotherapy.
- Wound management, including sterile dressings, medication for open wounds, burns and surgical sites.

Specific skilled nursing home care treatment by RNs cont:

- Enterostomal therapy, including ostomy care, care of tube sites, pressure sores and skin care.
- Catheter irrigation and changes.
- Diabetic and nutritional care.

- Tracheostomy aspiration.
- Tube feeding, including adjustment and suctioning of tubes.
- Ventilation therapy.

Examples of nursing care by LPNs:

- Provide services listed above, under RN supervision (except ventilation therapy).
- Draw blood, administer injections and blood pressures.
- Assist with Fleet enemas.
- Home Health Aide Care Services are provided by CNAs and/or Home Health Aides (HHAs).

Personal care:

- Bathing, dressing, grooming, general hygiene.
- Assistance with ambulance, feeding, meal preparation, bed linen changes and positioning in bed.
- Help in managing incontinence.
- Help with routine exercise and rehabilitation therapy programs.

Rehabilitative Therapies

Services are provided by licensed physical therapists (LPTs), occupational therapists (OTs), speech therapists and respiratory therapists. • **Physical Therapy:** Helps restore function or prevent loss

• **Physical Therapy:** Helps restore function or prevent lo following surgery, illness, or physical injury.

Examples of treatment include therapeutic exercise, traction, massage, gait training to restore lost ability to walk, use of prosthetic devices, ultrasound therapy and whirlpool.

• **Occupational Therapy:** Helps patient accomplish daily living independence through education and training in personal care, maximize functions with disability, developing coping techniques and vocational training.

• **Speech Therapy:** Enables patient to communicate by education and training in techniques to overcome speech problems caused by injury or neurological disease.

• **Respiratory Therapy:** Overcomes respiratory problems caused by illness or chronic disease by training and help in the use and maintenance of breathing aids and administration of medication.

Nutritional Services

Services provided by Registered Dietitians (RD) and RNs specializing in diabetes. Enhances health by counseling patients requiring special nutrition therapy and education. Monitoring insulin therapy and training diabetics in nutrition is involved.

Skilled Nursing Facilities

The nursing facilities differ in size and environment. All of them welcome inquiries and provide on-site tours and information.

The patient's physician will often be involved in the decision to be admitted to a nursing facility, but will not select the facility. The physician must write an order for nursing facility care for those covered by Medicare or Medicaid. Prospective nursing facilities should be visited before selection and assessment made for criteria such as:

- Fees and insurance coverage
- Physical facilities and environment
- Services provided, including amenities
- Staff size and duties

The patient or family should try to talk with families of people who are in nursing facilities. Asking questions of the nursing facility staff is very important.

* Long-Term Care Insurance for custodial care in a nursing facility is available through private insurance carriers. Custodial care is not covered by Medicare or most Medicare Supplement policies. Such insurance, if indicated by personal finances and other criteria, should be purchased before the applicant requires care.





VISION

Problems with vision vary widely.

As we age our lens become more rigid. This makes it more difficult to read at close range. Glasses or corrective lens are required, with changes in prescription normally required as we grow older. A summary of other vision problems that can occur as we age follows:

Cataracts are a condition where the lens become cloudy, causing vision to blur. The condition is progressive as we age. Cataracts are removed by surgery, and the cloudy lens normally replaced by a plastic "intravascular lens." Surgery is normally done on an outpatient basis.

Diabetic Retinopathy can occur through changes in the body's blood vessels caused by diabetes mellitus. Damage to blood vessels in the retina can cause vision problems, which are diagnosed and treated by ophthalmologists.

Floaters are small specks consisting of gel that move in the fluid that fills the inside of the eye. New floaters should be checked by an ophthalmologist.

Glaucoma is a disease of the optic nerve, normally without symptoms in early stages. Eventually it may cause blindness. Early diagnosis is important. Treatment includes eye drops. Surgery may also be necessary to arrest the disease.

Mascular Degeneration is damage to the macula, a part of the eye related to seeing fine details. Vision is gradually lost in the central part of the retina, but not peripheral (side) vision. Optical devices and support services are available to help cope with the problem.

Support for people with vision problems in Indian River County is extensive.

Ophthalmologists are medical doctors (M.D.'s) who specialize in the diagnosis and treatment of disorders of the eye and provide complete vision care.

Surgery is performed to repair ailments, such as cataracts and retinal detachments. Glaucoma is diagnosed and treated. Surgery is performed for nearsightedness and astigmatism. Detection of diseases in other parts of the body may be made through eye examination, such as diabetes, thyroid disease, brain tumors and hypertension. Comprehensive eye examinations and prescriptions for eyeglasses and contact lenses are given.

Optometrists are in the profession of examining, measuring, and treating visual defects by means of corrective lenses or other methods.

Opticians are in the profession of making lenses and eyeglasses.



If you live in Florida and have trouble reading print as the result of an eye problem, a reading disability, or difficulty holding a book because of arthritis, a stroke, or an accident, you may apply for Bureau of Braille and Talking Books Library services. Libraries, nursing homes, hospitals, schools, and other Florida institutions with customers who have disabilities which impede their use of conventional print may also apply for services.

- Equipment needed for the service is loaned to custome by the Library, including digital players and accessories
- Books are also accessible from the Braille and Aud Reading Download (BARD) website using personal device such as iPhones, iPods, Android devices, Victor Streams, an BrailleNotes.
- Catalogs are mailed bimonthly to inform custome about new books and magazines added to the collection Recorded book customers usually receive Talking Bo Topics, while Braille readers most often subscribe to Brail Book Review. These catalogs are used to select and ord reading materials. A complete book catalog is also available at the NLS Web site.

- Print and audiovisual materials on the subjects of blindne disability, and rehabilitation are available for research as public education.

Courtesies and Helpful hints when you meet a visually impaired person.

- Identify yourself when initiating a conversation.
- Do not speak through a third person when addressin someone who is blind.
- It's perfectly okay to use words like watch, look and s when talking to someone who is blind.
- Offer assistance but don't assume the person needs he
- Describe the layout of large rooms. When entering meeting or conference room with someone who is blind visually impaired, a brief description of how the furnitu is arranged can make it easier for that person to naviga surroundings.
- Always push your chair in, keep cabinet doors and draw closed. Doors should remain closed or open never ajar
- DONT be afraid to ask questions. .
- Give a verbal indication when you walk away from conversation or leave the room.

HEARING

Problems with hearing vary widely from slight hearing loss to deafness and are caused by a variety of factors. It is common to lose hearing acuity as people grow older and hearing problems are often associated with the elderly. Progressive hearing loss may begin with the inability to hear high frequency sounds and then conversational speech. The cause may be genetic, the effects of disease, such as high blood pressure, or the result of exposure to noise.

Otolaryngologist is the formal name of an ear-nose-throat doctor, or ENT. They are physicians dealing with medical issues related to the ear, nose, throat, and larynx as well as areas around the head and neck, with expertise in a vast array of medical issues, from cancers to allergies to sinus problems to major trauma. They have a medical Ph.D. and have experience with general surgery. Often, they'll perform minor surgeries; they're also the doctors you'd see if you needed your tonsils taken out. In general, you'll be sent to an otolaryngologist if you're having a medical hearing problem or ear disorder. Often, if your impairment is one that's possible to treat with surgery, you'll talk to an ENT.

Audiologists and Hearing Aid Specialists are technicians trained to test hearing loss and fit hearing aids. They conduct a variety of tests to determine the exact nature of an individual's hearing problem.

The tests are conducted in a sound treated room with equipment that can measure the type of hearing loss and it's magnitude. The audiologist interprets the results and recommends aids to treat the problem. They also check the medically related hearing problems and refer clients with such problems to otolaryngologists.

People with impaired hearing may use devices, which assist hearing, such as portable microphones, amplifiers, and earphones. Also devices are available to augment the use of the telephone. Hearing aids are battery-powered instruments that filter and amplify sound. Hearing aids should be custom fitted. A trial and adjustment period is usual.

COSTS FOR PLANS & SUPPLEMENTAL COVERAGE

DRUG COVERAGE (PART D)

Monthly premiums vary based on which plan you join. The amount can change each year. You may also have to pay an extra amount each month based on your income. Who pays an extra amount because of income?

You might pay a penalty if you:

- Don't join a Medicare drug plan when you first get Medicare, and
- Go 63 days or more without creditable drug coverage (coverage that's similar in value to Part D).

How much is the Part D penalty?

- You'll pay an extra 1% for each month (that's 12% a year) you could have signed up for Part D, but didn't.
- The penalty is added to your monthly premium.
- It's not a one-time late fee you'll pay the penalty each month for as long as you have Part D coverage (even if you change plans).
- If you have creditable drug coverage or if you qualify for extra help, you won't have to pay a penalty.

When you get prescription drugs

Most plans charge a deductible, an amount you pay before the plan starts to pay, for prescriptions you fill. The deductible amount varies based on which plan you join.

Your actual costs vary depending on the medicines you take, if they are on your plan's list of covered drugs, and which pharmacy you use.

Get help with drug costs

If you have limited income and resources, you may be able to get Extra Help to pay your plan premiums and other drug costs (like deductibles, coinsurance, and copays). If you qualify, you won't have to pay the Part D late enrollment penalty.

MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLAN (PART C)

You get all of your Medicare Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) coverage, and prescription drug coverage (Part D), through these plans. Medicare Advantage Plans with prescription drug coverage are sometimes called "MA-PDs." You must have Part A and Part B to join a Medicare Advantage Plan.

- Monthly premiums vary based on which plan you join. The amount can change each year.
- You must keep paying your Part B premium to stay in your plan.
- Deductibles, co-insurance, and co-payments may vary based on which plan you join.
- Plans also have a yearly limit on what you pay out-ofpocket. Once you pay the plans limit, the plan pays 100% for covered health services for the rest of the year.

MEDICARE SUPPLEMENT INSURANCE

"Medigap" insurance is a Medicare Supplement Insurance policy that helps pay some of the health care costs that Original Medicare doesn't cover, like:

- Monthly premiums vary based on which policy you buy, where you live, and other factors. The amount can change each year.
- You must keep paying your Part B premium to keep your supplement insurance.
- Helps lower your share of costs for Part A and Part B services in Original Medicare.
- Some Medigap policies include extra benefits to lower your costs, like coverage when you travel out of the country.
- Medigap policies are sold by private companies.
- Medicare will pay its share of the Medicare-approved amount for covered health care costs, then your Medigap policy pays its share.

MEDICAID

The purpose of the Medicaid program is to help people who receive public assistance and/or have low income to meet the costs of medical care. Medicaid helps those in need of any age, as well as the disabled.

The program is administered by the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF). There are various types of programs, with different eligibility standards. Apply at:

OPTIONAL STATE SUPPLEMENT

Another program called OSS (Optional State Supplement) is designed to help clients eligible for adult family care homes (foster homes) avoid being institutionalized by supplementing the monthly payment for adult family care.

LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE

Insurance to cover custodial long-term care in a nursi facility or at home is available through private insurance carriers. Custodial care is not covered by Medicare or mo medigap policies.

INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE

United Way of Indian River County is once agai coordinating the IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VIT) program, offering free help to people who earned \$60,000 less in 2023.

Families with low to moderate income may miss out substantial tax credits if they don't have assistance filing th returns. To become an eligible Community Coach rider, Senior Resource Association's process is easy and will get you riding in no time. Community Coach is a shared-ride service so passengers should be prepared to make stops along the way to their destination. Personal care attendants who accompany riders travel at no cost and reservations are required.

DayAway Adult Enrichment & Respite

Aging provides an opportunity to pursue passions and socialize with others. Senior Resource Association' DayAway program offers a platform for social inclusion, ageappropriate activities, support, and community engagement with programs designed for older adults and those over age 18 with physical or cognitive health challenges. Most participants attend on a regular schedule, often according to the needs or desire to participate in specific enrichment activities. SRA is licensed by Florida's Agency for Healthcare Administration with a specialization in Alzheimer's and memory care.

Programs and activities are offered at two locations in Vero and Sebastian. Monday-Friday 7:30am-5:30pm. To schedule a tour of these stimulating programs, please call for an appointment.

Public Guardian Program

Provides legal and professional guardianship services that protect and exercise the legal rights of adults who are deemed by the court to lack the capacity to make decisions and care for themselves. For more information, contact Senior Resource Association.

Senior Supportive Services

Promotes independence by assisting seniors, caregivers, and out-of-town families in the selection of appropriate health, wellness, and daily living services, including but not limited to the following:

- In-Home Services: Experienced Case Managers assist older adults and their loved ones in determining which services are needed to improve quality of life. Services include, but are not limited to, companionship, meal preparation, light housekeeping, medication management, emergency alert response systems, durable medical equipment, pest control, and counseling.

- Meals on Wheels of Indian River County: Senior Resource Association reduces hunger and isolation while improving the health and safety of seniors throughout Indian River County. Nutrition programs include the following:
- Home Delivered Meals: A trained volunteer delivers a hot, nutritious lunch five days a week, plus frozen meals for the weekend, to homebound seniors who cannot shop or prepare meals for themselves. Meals and wellness visis are available to qualified seniors living in Indian River County, subject to eligibility and funding. The program is also available on a private-pay basis.
- Social Dining Sites: Nutritious lunches are available to mobile seniors at locations around the county. In addition to meeting one-third of the daily nutritional requirements, Social Dining Sites offer seniors the opportunity to meet others and enjoy a friendly dining room atmosphere. Subject to eligibility.
- **Emergency Meals on Wheels:** A short-term program provided at no cost to assist with recovery. A nutritious, daily lunch and friendly visit by a trained volunteer is provided to seniors who have been discharged from a healthcare facility within the last 30 days/or whose caregiver has been admitted to a healthcare facility for a brief period.
- Pet Meals on Wheels: Because pets provide companionship and health benefits for older adults, SRA proudly supports providing pet food for Meals on Wheels recipients' pets when funding allows.


